

Town Board Minutes May 2, 2007

Present: Councilmen Brien M. Hopkins, Councilman Richard K. Hawkins, Councilwoman Cathleen M. Dobson and Supervisor William A. Eagan.

Florence Wendling, St. John the Baptist Church, opened the meeting with a prayer.

A motion was made by Supervisor Eagan and seconded by Councilman Hopkins to adopt the minutes of the April 18, 2007 regular meeting.

A motion was made by Councilman Hopkins and seconded by Councilman Hawkins, upon review by the Town Board, that fund bills on the Abstract dated April 26, 2007 in the amount of \$90,866.70 be paid.
