Thanked Vince Mangino and Renee Siepinski for their service to the CAC. Letter of gratitude received from Barbara Moore; the Town of Boston/Connect Life Blood Drive was held March 20th in the Connect Life mobile unit in the parking lot of the Patchin Volunteer Fire Company. Maximum number of donors and collected 16 units of whole blood. Will try to extend the hours for the next drive to accommodate all who wish to give. Many thanks to all who donated non-perishable food items in the Town Hall collection boxes. Much needed goods were delivered to the Response to Love Center, as they produce 200 plus meals daily.

Councilwoman Martin reported on the following:

Saddened to hear of Vince Mangino's and Renee Siepierski's resignations from the Conservation Advisory Council. They have worked on adding new events for the Town. If any resident has conservation or environmental beliefs, the CAC needs members.

Councilwoman Lucachik reported on the following:

Councilwoman Selby reported on the following:

Thanked Vince Mangino and Renee Siepierski for their service to the CAC.
Thanked Supervisor Keding for the invite to help out at the FeedMore WNY event.

Supervisor Keding reported on the following:

The FeedMore WNY event served 111 families with nutritious meals. There was a press release sent to local media and posted on social media. Unfortunately, there is not just one way to reach everyone. If there is another FeedMore WNY event in Boston, the CodeRed notification system may be used. Thanked all that volunteered at the event.

National Fuel will be looking into updating the well and lines on Holiday Drive, due to the motor vehicle accident that happened a few months ago.

The Boys and Girls Club will be donating gift cards from some of the proceeds from the Chicken BBQ to some families that have a need at this time of the pandemic.

The Hillcroft Bridge will hopefully be completed October of this year. Legislator Mills has been involved with this project.

There is a core group of Supervisor's and Mayor's across Erie County that are notifying the Federal Government that there are multiple streams of revenue that have been lost in municipalities. The Town is approximately 23% below the 2019 amount, sales tax makes up about 20% that the Town takes in. Meeting with Congressman Reed and other elected officials to push for additional funding for local government.
